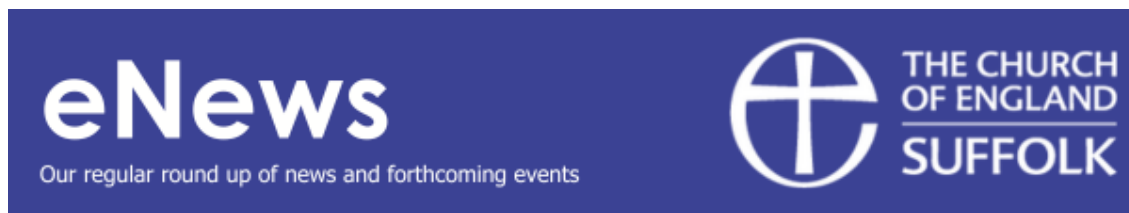


Thursday 20 July 2023

Bishop Martin and the team visit the Cathedral being built in Kagera

Bishop Martin, the Revd Jutta Brueck; the Revd Sarah Geileskey and her husband Adam; the Revd Susan Taylor and the Revd Sarah Gull have arrived safely in Kagera. Bishop Darlington welcomed them at the border and there was a welcome party of dancing and singing in Murgwanza. On Sunday the group visited the new Cathedral building in Murgwanza and visited the opening of St Paul's Church in Rulenga. Bishop Martin and the two Sarahs supported at Holy Communion along with the Revd Amon Jackson. They have also been treated to a song and dance welcome by the Mothers' Union in Murukulazo.

This week the group have also visited schools, where Scouts presented Bishop Martin with a Scout scarf while attending the Good Shepherd Secondary school he met students from Ngara Anglican Primary School and led prayers at the Murgwanze Primary School for children with special needs. The Revd Canon Amon, Principal of Kagera Christian Theological College, took them to meet an Evangelist who has built up the congregation in Kumumena such that it is now turning into a parish, and they also visited the new vicarage there. They have seen water holes and water tanks, farming communities, a tree nursery, avocados and grain stores. The group have also visited the emergency room in the Murgwanze hospital to see the new Blood Analyser and a new pharmacology teaching lab which is hoped to open in October.

Overall, the trip has been inspiring and full of impromptu singing and dancing in schools and churches and we look forward to hearing more when the group return home.




FAITH Empowered

Faith empowered is training for those wishing to become Parish Evangelists, those interested in reaching out to people who have yet to discover the love of God for themselves. God is still calling people to know him, and we want to help you to be better equipped to respond to what he is doing. Over an academic year this course explores:

Faith Empowered - training for Evangelists

Evangelists want to help other Christians be confident about their own faith story, and enable them to get involved in missional activity where they are. Across our diocese, Evangelists minister in church groups, pubs, within new housing estates and some are involved in running Café Church, chaplaincy, and other outreach activities.

Faith Empowered is a one-year course (September 2023 to July 2024) exploring this ministry, using materials from the Church Army. Participants come together in person and online to discuss key subjects such as how to get to know your context, what evangelism is, how to plan a missional activity and what to say

when people ask big questions. Following the training some go back to their neighbourhoods and get on with what they can do there, whilst others will go on to licensed ministry.

The SHCT is a charity that raises money for the preservation, repair and maintenance of churches and chapels in the County of Suffolk. This year is their 50th anniversary and a new hymn, 'Stand on the faith', has been written to celebrate their birthday! It will be released this Friday, 21 July 2023 on YouTube and on Saturday 22 July on all audio streaming platforms.

Experienced local musician, songwriter and producer, Andrew Rayner, from Wendy House Music in Felixstowe, wrote the song. The hymn was recorded and filmed in Fornham All Saints church with the key stage 2 children from Sextons Manor School in Bury St Edmunds. As well as the song being released on all streaming platforms, they will sing the song at a special service at St Edmundsbury Cathedral in September.

"This was an amazing opportunity for us at Sexton's Manor", said music teacher Emma Jones. "The children have loved learning the song and it has become our song of the year! It was a privilege to work with Andy Raynor and to be part of such a great project. The children had great fun recording and filming for the song and can't wait to show their

families and friends the final results of their hard work."

Completing this gives you a baseline position and helps you to track your progress towards becoming net zero carbon by 2030.
