Storm in a soup bowl

The Revd Karen Burton, Team Rector, Blackbourne Team Ministry was so pleased that the church community was able to help during Storm Eunice. Having lost power during the storm, Ben Lord from the Ixworth Parish Council announced on Facebook that the village hall had opened for people to come along to warm up, a hot drink and to fill up a flask. Meanwhile staff at The Beeches, a local residential home, were struggling to provide residents a hot meal. Karen says "Priscilla Mann from the church knew that I had a lot of soup and bread rolls in my freezer, left over from an event just before Christmas. I popped up to The Beeches to borrow their pans, and along with others in the village, we defrosted everything and got the soup piping hot before walking it up the High Street for dinner. It was wonderful to see people to come together during the storm - knocking on doors to see if neighbours were ok, spreading the word that there was a warm place to go to". Karen adds, "The Beeches holds a special place in the heart of our villages and we are all proud of the love and care staff show to our friends and family who are resident there. The Parish Council and Church coming together to help during the storm was a real privilege and a joy to be part of."

Funding boost for two Suffolk churches

Two Suffolk churches are to receive a share in a £1.5 million grant fund, thanks to an investment from the Heritage Stimulus Fund, part of the Government's Culture Recovery Fund. 17 grants were made to churches across the country and aimed to support and bolster local economies and jobs across the country, and will open up heritage and the benefits it can bring to people.

St Mary, Homersfield received a £68,389 grant to keep the church at the heart of the local community by funding the stripping and re-slating the Chancel, Nave and Porch roofs to ensure protection against rainwater, and repairing the most significant settlement cracks and eroded flintwork, joints and stonework in the tower.

St Andrew, Rushmere St Andrew has been awarded a £32,873 grant to fund urgent repairs on the north slope of the main Nave and North Aisle roof with new flashings for the tower.

Claire Walker, CEO National Churches Trust, said: "Historic local places of worship are a vital part of our national heritage. The funding is a vote of confidence in the future of historic church buildings and a recognition of their importance to society."

Edmund Harris, DAC Secretary, said: "This is welcome, both these grants cover big ticket items that are essential to keep the fabric of the church in good order and parishes often struggle to fund these types of projects".
